and Quiet,” he adds.



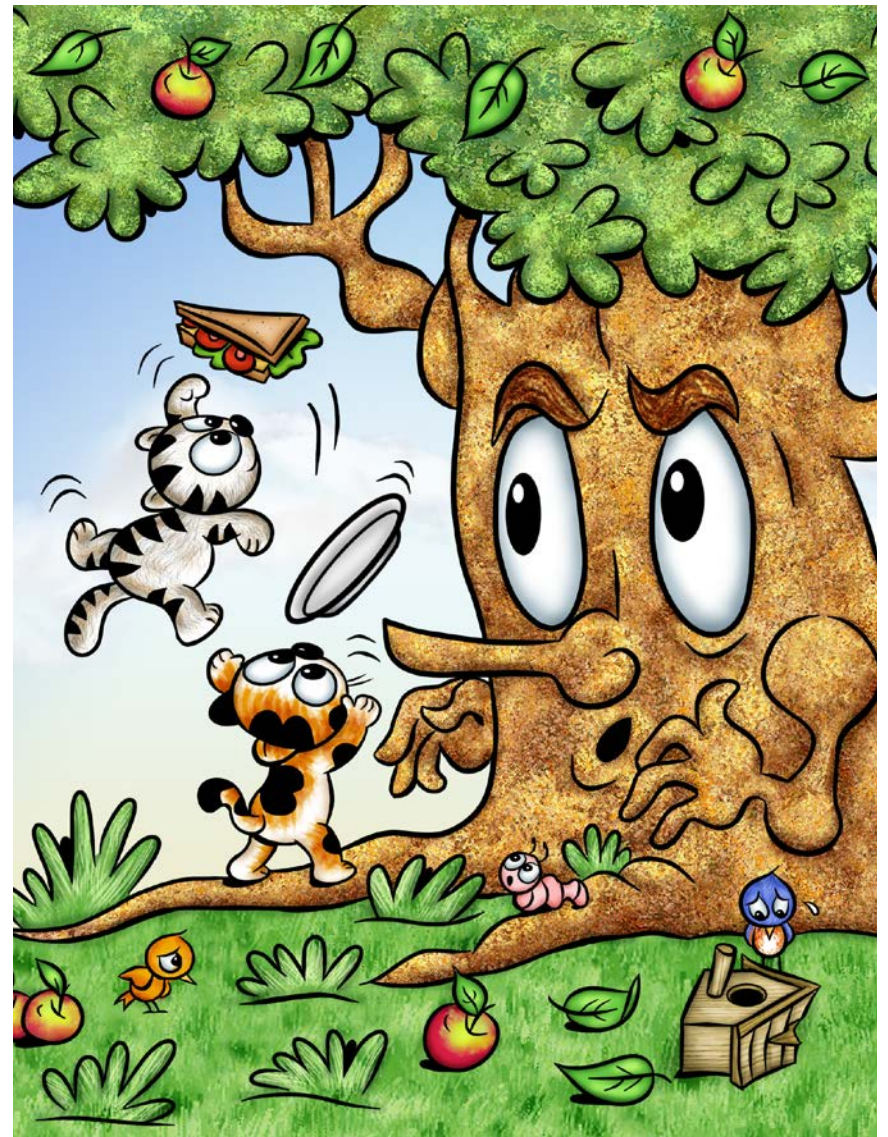
Tosh puts clothes out to dry.

to shreds.



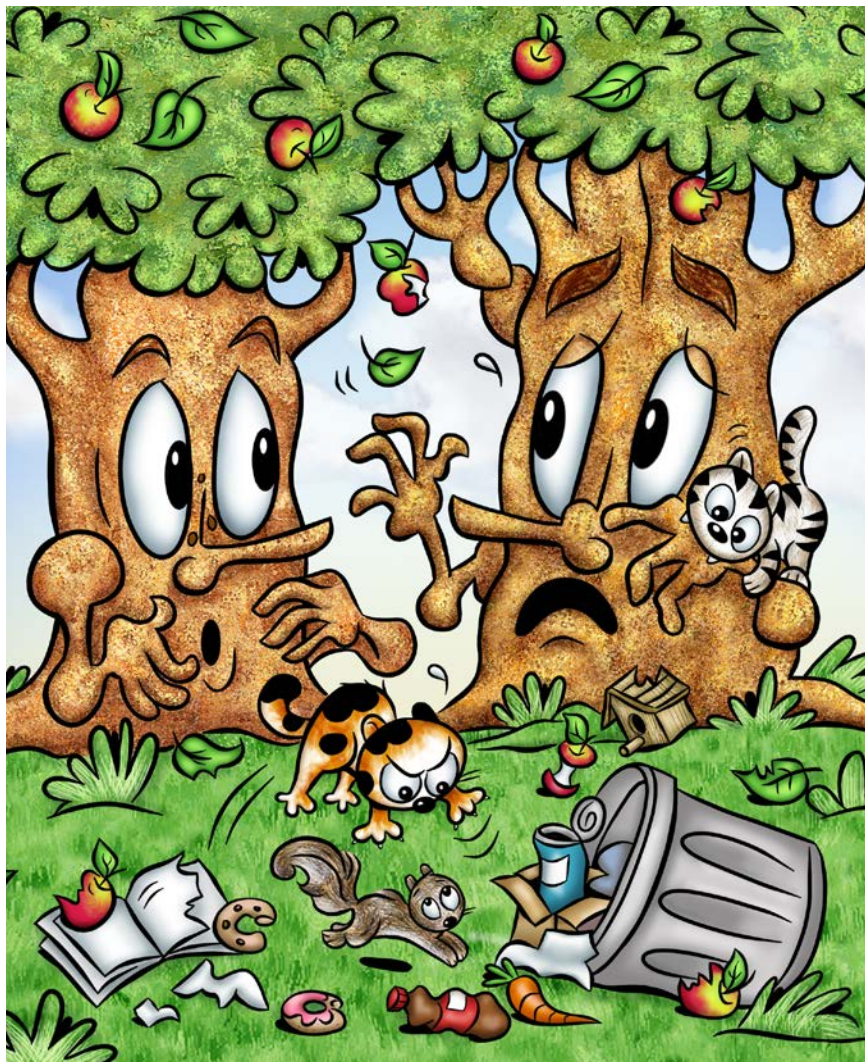
Tosh reads his book.

Quiet swings in his branches.

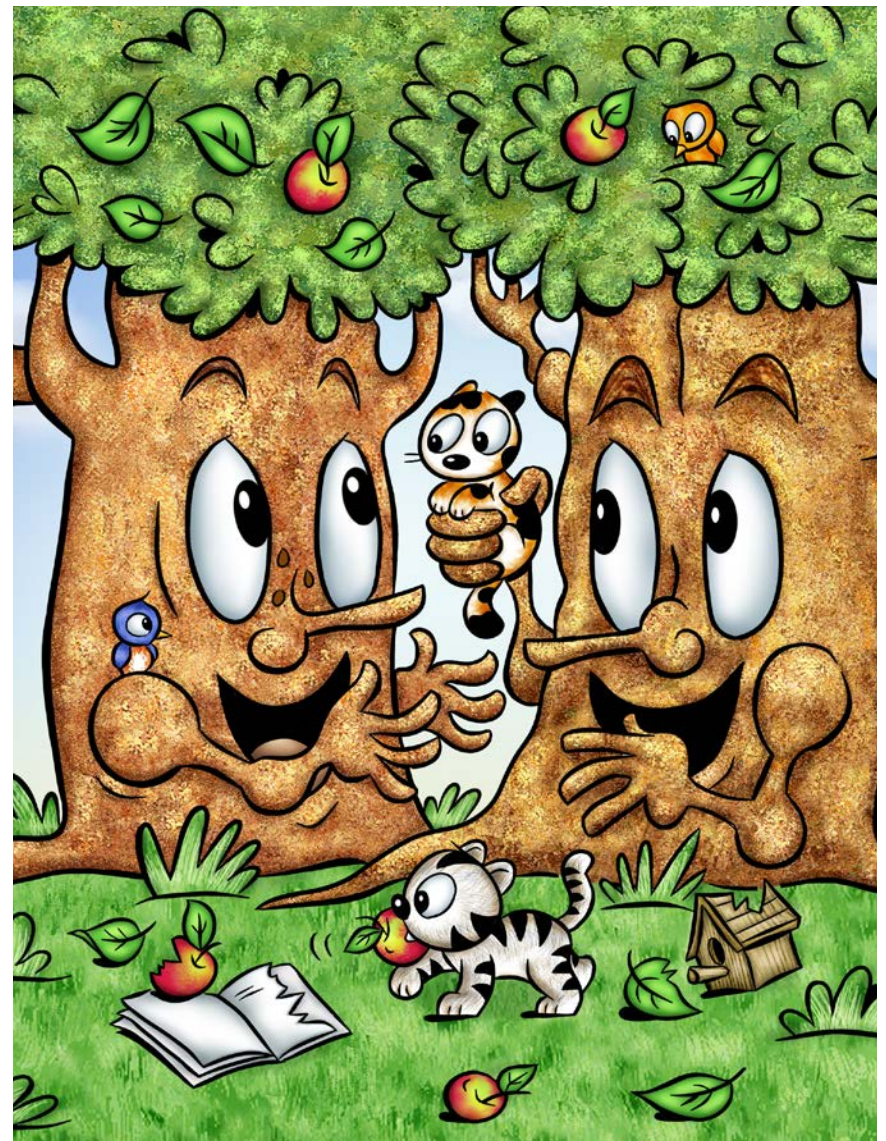


Tosh wants a snack.

Quiet bats it into the air.



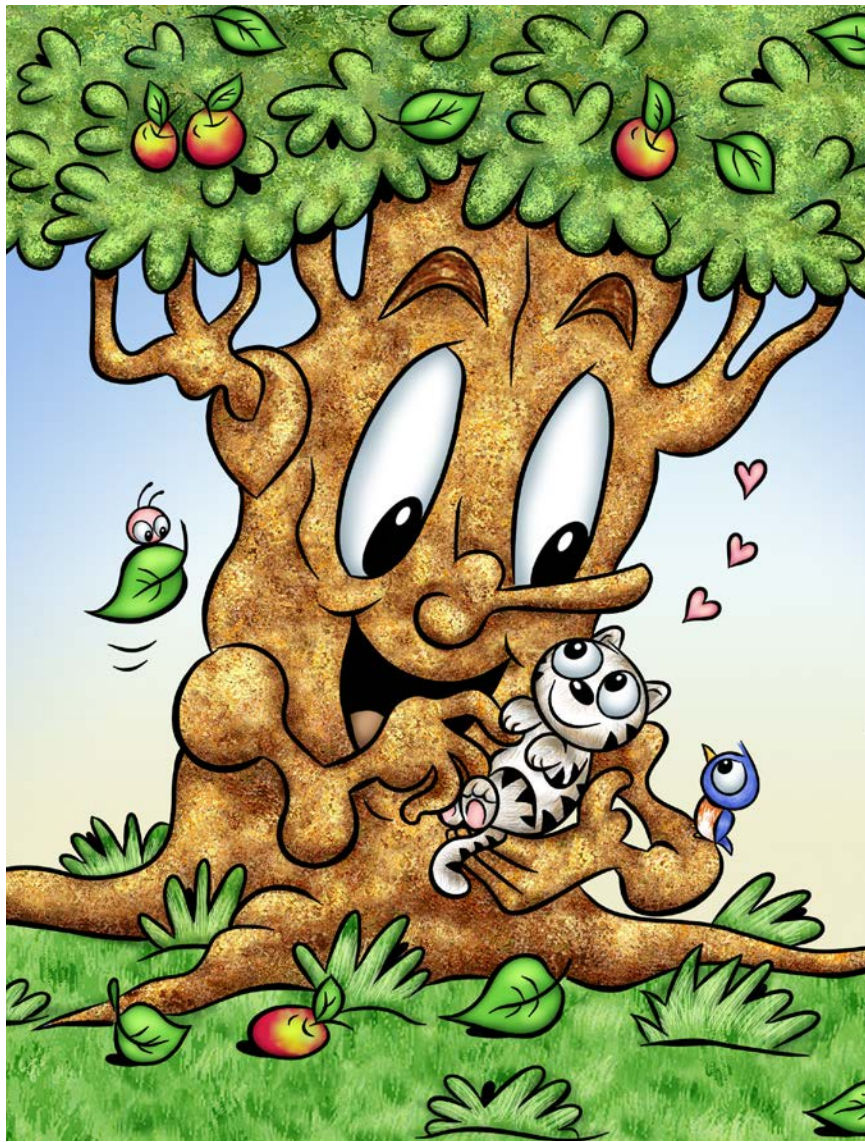
“Mac, please help me!”

peaceful or quiet,” says Tosh.

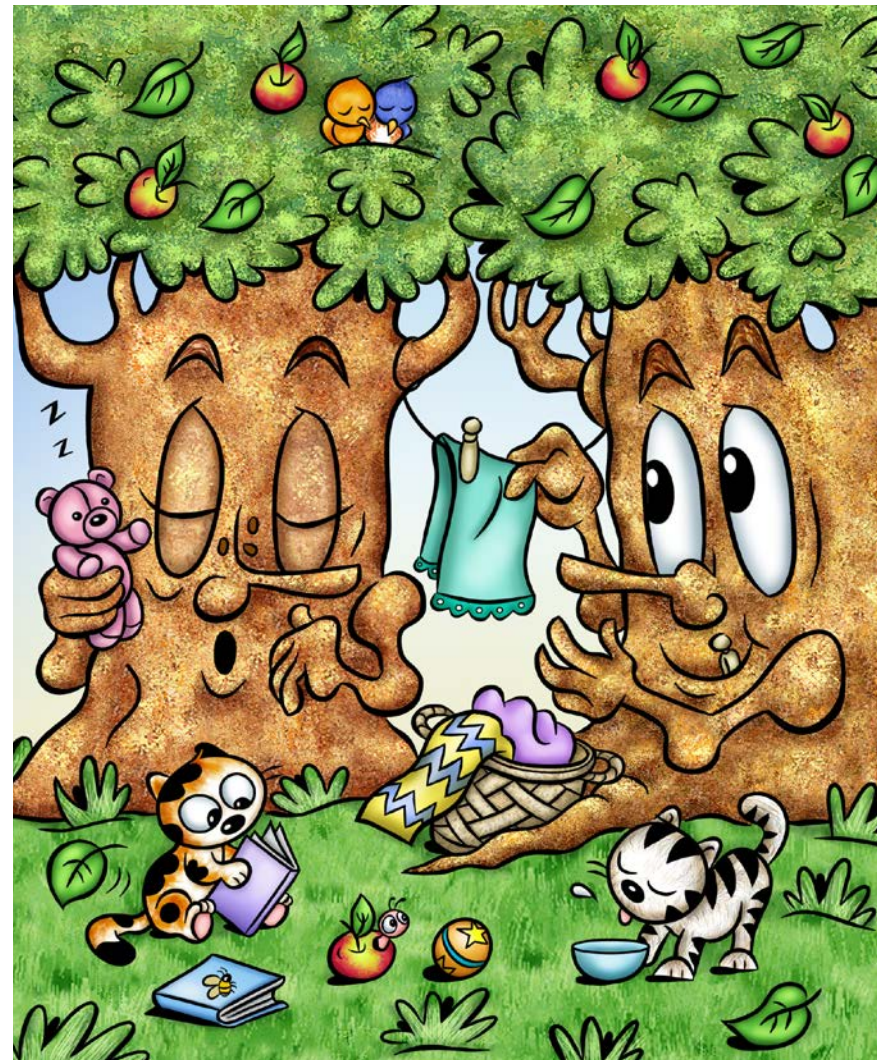


“Give me Peace,” says Mac.
