



Two little kittens in a box stare back at him.

"I will call you Peace and Quiet," he adds.









Tosh reads his book.

Tosh takes a nap.


Peace pokes Tosh in the eye.

Tosh wants a snack.


Peace bumps it off the plate.

Quiet bats it into the air.




"Mac, please help me!" cries Tosh.

"Peace and Quiet are not peaceful or quiet," says Tosh.




"Give me Peace," says Mac.
