


A young goat was walking across a field. Suddenly, a hungry wolf jumped out of the bushes.




The goat ran for his life, but the wolf soon caught him.


The hungry wolf licked his lips.

"I want to hear music once more in my life," said the goat.


"Would you please sing me a song before you eat me?" he asked.






"Why not?" he laughed.


"I can still eat you when I am done singing," the wolf growled.

His mighty voice was loud and strong.




A pack of dogs lived nearby on a farm.




The wolf's howls soon brought the farmer's dogs running.




The pack of dogs quickly chased off the wolf.
