The pennies are counted，put into bags，and sent to banks around the United States．


A machine uses a model of the relief to carve the drawing into a hard steel stamp．

The coin starts off as a blank piece of metal with no pictures on it．


The cut blanks go through a washer and dryer．

The artist carves the pictures into a sculpture called a relief．


The mint asks an artist to draw pictures for the coin＇s front and back．


A machine pushes up a rim around the edge of the blank．

The cut blank is heated until it is soft．

The blank is struck with the artist＇s steel stamp．

A worker checks the penny under a magnifying glass．
