


Throughout all of Russia were meat and potatoes.


In Israel, the reddest and ripest tomatoes.




In India, spices.

In Tibet, furry yaks.


In Nepal, she smelled goats that climbed mountains in packs.






In Egypt were camels.

The whole world smelled of some strange-smelling mammals!




One thing Kinley knew:
